### **Disabled access to St Peter & St Paul**

When old buildings such as the Church of St Peter & St Paul in Edenbridge were constructed several hundred years ago, access requirements were not a major consideration.

The Parish Church has good facilities for those with disabilities.

Entering through the west door, under the tower, requires neither steps nor a ramp. This door is open for all services: if you want to visit when a service is not in progress contact Pam Gadd in advance to arrange to be met and the door to be unlocked.

Once inside the church there is level access throughout, except to the Martin Chapel where there is one step. All altars are on a dais.

Pews have been removed to allow

wheelchair users to sit in the main body of the church: this is also appreciated by those who use other mobility aids or assistance dogs.

There is an access toilet in the choir vestry near the west door.

Light levels vary according to the time of day and contrast is not always possible for those with visual impairments; we are restricted by regulations because the church is 900 years old.

The church has an audio T loop for use during services.

The Church does not have its own car park, but blue badge holders can park for three hours on the single yellow lines in Church Street where there is one designated blue badge bay. There are three designated blue badge bays in Market Street car park.

Access to the church from the Market Street car park is level, while from Church Street there is a slight incline.

Rev Mark Brown is **Rural Dean** for the Tonbridge Deanery. Since our church AGM earlier this year, the **Lay representatives** for 2014-2017 are: Laurence Hood, Stuart Parrish, and me, Bernard Oldfield.

The representatives attend Deanery Synod meetings during the year, and report back to the Parochial Church Council (PCC) from those meetings. Deanery Synod representatives are automatically members of the PCC. Matters discussed or reports from General Synod are highlighted at the Deanery Synod meetings.

We are also in the **Archdeanery of Tonbridge**, overseen by the Venerable Clive Mansell, **Archdeacon of Tonbridge**. The Archdeaconry covers West Kent from Burham and Wouldham (just south of Rochester) westwards to beyond

Westerham and **Edenbridge**, down to Tunbridge Wells and further south to Lamberhurst and Matfield, before coming eastward again through Yalding, Hunton, Coxheath and Barming on the western edge of Maidstone. There are over 100 churches in the Archdeaconry.

There are six deaneries in the Archdeaconry: Malling; Paddock Wood; Sevenoaks; Shoreham; **Tonbridge**; and Tunbridge Wells.
